Voice for the Voiceless Thailand



Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." John 14:6



Our team of eight missionaries went to Thailand this past November and December 2023. Five of our team members stayed for three weeks. The Dixons stayed in Thailand for two months.

As soon as we arrived in our village we had a packing party to put together the gift bags for home visits and backpacks for

school ministry.

During this trip we gave away more than 2000

backpacks, served more than 2000 lunches and shared Jesus through English classes with more than 2000 children ages 4-13. We also gave backpacks to children in our villages and at our Bible studies who had never received them.



We began each day with team devotions and prayer for the day's ministry site. After breakfast we headed out to our school. As we neared each

school, an excitement grew within us because we knew that God had us there and children were about to hear, for the very first time, about the one, true God. We also had schools ask us to teach them the true meaning of Christmas.

We used the VBS model to teach the children English and used scripture to do so. We had six rotations: ABCs, object identification, *The Roman Road*, song & dance, exercise and *Sin Water*. The children had a really great time and loved learning about the God who loves them. We were able to give each of these children backpacks, which contained Gospel tracts. One of our schools asked for shoes for their children rather than backpacks so we provided 79 pairs of shoes.







"Thank you for sharing your Jesus with our students," said a teacher from one of our K-6 schools. "I thank your God for sending you and your team to us," she added.

Another teacher said, "I truly see you and your team's love for our children and we thank you so much."

"How can I believe in God if I cannot see him?" asked an elderly woman during home visits as we shared the Gospel with her.

"Why do you love us so much?" asked a group of teen boys. "Because God first loved you," we told them.

We continued to do home visits, having visited 50 homes distributing 69 food bags. As we shared the Gospel with people during these visits, the vast majority of people asked Jesus to be their Lord and Savior.




We had a purity/pro-life class for our core children with 12 in attendance. We taught them how God formed them in the womb using the "Touch of Life in the Womb" models. Before this lesson the children had never been shown how God had formed them and how much He loves them. One girl and one boy asked Jesus to be their Lord and Savior during this class.



One of our students, 10-year-old Dangmo, has been with us since 2019 when she received Christ. She lives with her grandparents, auntie and 84-year-old great-grandma. When we visited her family, one of our teammembers, Don, was sharing the Gospel with Auntie and Grandma and Grandpa. They all wanted to receive Christ as their Savior. Just as we were about to pray with them, we heard

Great-Grandma walk from the back room on her cane and she said, "Wait, I want to accept Jesus, too!" We all looked to the place from where she came to see if there were any others



This entire family, with the exception of Great-Grandma, went with us to the baptisms on December 10, which were going to take place at some beautiful waterfalls, an hour and a half drive away. They invited another uncle, aunt and their 7-year-old girl. On the way, the older aunt told the younger uncle, aunt and the girl about Jesus and what He did for them. By the time we arrived at the waterfalls those three wanted to get baptized as well. We explained the Gospel to them and they, too, received Jesus as their Lord and Savior and were immediately baptized. On January 19, 2024 we baptized Dangmo's great-grandma in a tub full of water at their home in the village. We baptized 19 children and 7 adults in all.

In October 2016 we began what would later become "Voice for the Voiceless Thailand" with two schools. God has since expanded our territory and as of January 2024 we are in 17 schools and many homes. God never disappoints. He also prepares us for what He wants us to do. We've often asked God to reveal more of His plan to us, but He just gives us one step at a time.



This is actually good, because if He showed us His whole plan we would probably be overwhelmed. One day at a time and one soul at a time. We are privileged to have you all as our partners on this wonderful journey that God has placed us on. God bless you!

We are also happy to announce that through you, God has provided the entire amount of money needed to purchase the land that we asked you to pray for. We had the dilapidated house that was on the land demolished and brought in 308 truckloads of fill-dirt to level both pieces of land. We are now in the process of designing the floorplans

of the needed buildings for

this ministry. We will then send the plans on to Thailand for construction estimates for phase one of the project. Phase one will be the multi-purpose building, kitchen, classrooms and bathrooms.
