








Our brother-in-Christ, Ping, has been a great help to us while we are back in the U.S. Ping drives two hours from his home to come to our village every other week to set up the AV equipment and to transport the children to and from the house. We are very grateful to Ping for dedicating his time to this ministry and to our great God for bringing Ping to us. Ping recently told us,



"I have confirmation from God about serving with you guys. My business (a coffee shop) is doing so well and I have more time to serve. I feel really connected with the children and I have so much joy working with them."

Ping has also begun visiting the caretakers (usually grandparents) of our children who attend English classes. This is invaluable because it establishes and maintains the relationship with these parents. We are intent on reaching the parents and grandparents through their children.

As many of you know, Thailand and Cambodia were recently involved in armed conflict. More than 40 people were killed and hundreds of thousands were displaced in both countries. On July 28 a ceasefire was brokered by the United States and Malaysia, which is holding so far.













We have maintained ongoing relationships with the English teachers in the various schools



where we serve. We have also been contacted by four new schools for us to gain entrance to this next trip.
